

FAST ASCENT RATES CAUSE DECOMPRESSION INJURIES

Dr. Peter B. Bennett, prominent DAN staff physician, has studied decompression accidents in recent years and concludes, along with the European Underwater and Baromedical Society after their study last year, that fast ascent rates are the primary cause of bubble trouble. His recommendations to us sport divers making deep dives are:

- 1. Slow your ascent rate to ten (10) feet per minute.
- Make a deep safety stop for 5 min. at 1/2 your max. depth if your ascent rate is faster than 10 feet per minute.
- 3. Also make a safety stop of 3-5 min. at 15 ft.
- Your ascent from 15 ft. to the surface should take 1-2 min., not the usual bolt to the boat. This is the time of maximum bubble expansion.

Indian Key State Historic Site. (Possible snorkeling at the San Pedro underwater archaeological preserve - depending on seas and weather).

Rent or BYK and join us for a short paddle to Indian Key. Snorkel and explore the shallow reefs around the key. Indian Key history dates from the time of prehistoric Indians to the 1830's, when the key was the seat of the newly created Dade County. Jacob Housman bought the strategic key in 1831 and turned it into a busy port of wrecking. In 1838 Dr. Henry Perrine moved to India Key to pursue his interest in tropical botany where he was killed in an Indian attack in the early morning of August 7, 1840. Indian Key has remained uninhabited and Dr. Perrine's plants have grown over the ruins. For more information call Julio 305-551-7545.

OFF SEASON DIVING

As most of the members know, our season as a club ends this year on November 19th.

Many have asked why we don't continue with scheduled club dives into the winter months. The reason is the uncertainty of weather, resulting in many weatherrelated trip cancellations. This makes it very difficult to administer.

However, during the off-season, Lon and I do dive almost every weekend, weather permitting. Frequently, others have asked us to let them know when we do go, so they can join us.

This off-season, if you wish to be made aware of such dives, let me know. I will keep a list of those wishing to be notified, and will call each week we're going out, early in the week, and give you the opportunity to go with us.

These dives, however, are NOT Club Sponsored, so each person will call the appropriate shop that week to make his or her own reservation. There will be no ADA Safety Officer on duty and ADA assumes no liability or responsibility

\$1 MILLION SETTLEMENT IN CORAL REEF GROUNDING CASE (December 11, 2000)

In the largest settlement ever under the Park System Resources Protection Act (PSRPA), Biscayne National Park will receive \$1 million to cover costs associated with the November 1996 grounding of the vessel *M/T Igloo Moon*. The tanker, loaded with a potentially hazardous cargo of a chemical used in processing rubber, injured nearly 500 square meters of reef habitat, including live corals and other organisms.

40% OF FLORIDA REEFS DEAD!

A recent study by scientists concluded that 40% of the corals in the FI. Keys have died as the result of pollution and other causes. As reported in the Miami Herald, this should be of concern to all scuba divers, especially those of us living in S. Florida.
