Sun. May, 4 PM Islamorada

Just 4 miles past Tavernier, sites may include: Hammerhead, The Canyon, El Infante, Crocker, No Name, The Valley Aquarium, Alligator. Average depth 30-40', visibility 40-50'. Some current, many fish, shallow wrecks

Sat. May, 10 PM Tavernier

Sites may include: Conch Reef, Davis Ledge, Hens & Chickens, Little Conch, Capt. Tom's Ledge, 40' Ledge, Fish Trap, Horseshoe. Average depth 30', average visibility 40-60', many morays, schooling tropicals, unusual pillar corals.

Sat. May, 17 AM Biscayne Park (inc tanks)

Sites may include: Rocky Reef, Elkhorn Forest, Ball Buoy, Far Out Reef, Cuda Ledge. Usually no currents, massive corals, small caves. The Keys "Best Kept Secret", only one commercial boat allowed in area. Depth 20-30', vis 30-60'.

Sat. May, 24 PM Tenneco Towers (**Advanced**)

Choice of more than 40 wrecks. Some unlike anywhere else: Jet airliner, M-60 Tanks, Tankers, Freighters, Tugs, Barges. Most are intact with penetration possible. Average depth 90', visibility 40-50'. Expect currents and dramatic profiles, many fish. **See advanced criterion this issue.** 

### June

Sun. June, 1 PM S. Key Largo

Sites include: Molasses, Spanish Anchor, Hole-in-wall, French, Pickles. Average depth 35-40', average visibility 50-70', expect currents and high voltage action. High profile corals.

Sun. June, 8 AM Biscayne National Park ( **Advanced**)

Sites - The Wall, Anniversary, Rocky Reef, Elkhorn Forest, Cuda Ledge, Ball Buoy, Doc DeMilly. Expect currents, usually we drift dive the deep reefs. Depths 70-110', average visibility 40-80'. Only one commercial dive boat allowed in area. **See advanced criterion this issue.** 

Sat. June 14 PM Islamorada

Just 4 miles past Tavernier, sites may include: Hammerhead, The Canyon, El Infante, Crocker, No Name, The Valley Aquarium, Alligator. Average depth 30-40', visibility 40-50'. Some current, many fish, shallow wrecks.

Sat. June, 21 PM Lauderdale (Advanced)



### **ADA Photography Contest**

The Rules:

- 1. Pictures will be limited to South Florida Waters or ADA sponsored dives.
- 2. Pictures will be limited to two per month per diver.
- 3. The only editing allowed is overall color balance and sharpening. Please do not otherwise edit (including, but not limited to, crop, clone, fix, paint, saturate, cut, paste, move, or any other little button on there) out or in ANYTHING that is not part of the original image ( such as backscatter, ugly fish, ugly divers, etc.). We contemplate that the judge will take into consideration the images potential with cropping.

### The General Info:

- 1. There will be two initial categories: 1) Cameras with External Strobes and Manual Settings, & 2) "Point and Shoot" (Those without manual settings and/or external strobes).
- 2. Photographers can provide prints, slides or digital images. Entrees can only be returned if a Stamped, Self-addressed

### Are Divers Hurting Reefs?

Dozens of articles over the years have pointed out how careless divers harm the reefs, mainly by touching, grabbing, bumping and kicking them. However, Jean-Michel Cousteau was quoted in the Wall Street Journal (Sterba 1993) as saying that diver damage, while serious, is "insignificant" compared with other harmful factors such as soil runoff, chemical dumping, over fishing and boat anticological contents.

Unfortunately many divers do hurt reefs. While this is both tragic and preventable, other human (and non-diving) activities hurt them far more.

### **ADA RULES & REGULATIONS**

All Members Must be familiar with the following

# FOR ALL ADVANCED DIVES (DEPTHS OVER 60') ADA DIVERS MUST:

- 1. Be current (dive activity within the previous 3 months).
- 2. Have the approval of an ADA Safety Officer.
- 3. Have a minimum of 25 logged dives.
- Carry an alternate air source (octopus), time keeping device and depth gauge.
- 5. Have previous ADA diving experience.
- 6. All members must dive with at least a 72 cubic foot tank.

## ADA GUIDELINES FOR COMPUTER ASSISTED DIVING

- Members using dive computers may extend their time underwater ten-(10) minutes beyond the time allowed by the tables.
- Computer assisted dives must be well within the NO DECOMPRESSION LIMITS.
- Members should understand and follow the manufacturer's recommendations.
- 4. If a computer diver is buddyed with a diver using the tables, both must follow the tables.
- If a buddy-team is using unlike computers, both must follow the more conservative computer.
- If, in a buddy-team, either computer fails, both divers must terminate the dive.

## CANCELLATION AND REFUND POLICY FOR LOCAL DIVE TRIPS

Because of our contractual agreements with our service agents - dive shops and boat captains, we must notify them - usually seven days in advance - of the final number of spaces we are paying for. Thus, if our members cancel less than seven days in advance, we regret that NO REFUND OR CREDIT can be given, unless trip cancellation insurance has been purchased at the time of the dive trip payment (see next news article!)

### **ADA TRIP CANCELLATION INSURANCE**

The Board of Directors has approved a unique concept in local diving: NO FAULT INSURANCE!!

For an additional \$5.00, per person, per local dive trip, members can eliminate the worry of losing their dive fees because of an unforeseen change of plans.

If, for any reason you are unable to attend a local dive for which you are scheduled and have paid the insurance, ADA will credit your dive fee to another date. The \$5.00 insurance is non-transferable and non-refundable!

When you make a reservation, ask for dive trip cancellation insurance. The Board has elected to continue the insurance offer for this year.

NOTE: It may be discontinued at any time without prior written notice.

## IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM THE SAFETYTHE SAFETY OFFICERS' COMMITTEE

All members are reminded to read the "Rules & Guidelines for Diving Activities" you received with your membership package. Number 16 states, "All divers must be present for the pre-dive briefing". If the diver is not present for the entire briefing, diving privileges may be revoked for that dive. Please plan to arrive on time - or better yet - a bit early. We thank you and appreciate your cooperation.


### IMPORTANT WEATHER INFORMATION


Before departing for the dive site, confirm weather condition with Lon or the designated Safety Officer. It is the responsibility of the member to call; we cannot call you due to the large number of divers involved. For morning dives, call between 6 and 10 p.m. the night before the dive. For afternoon dives, call between 9 and 10 a.m. the morning of the dive.








REMEMBER: That family members must have completed individual documentation to register as ADA members.

### Do Fish Sleep?

For anyone who has ever done a night dive, the answer is apparent - many fish do sleep. During the day these fish keep their distance (unless we feed them), but at night some fish just over in water, seemingly oblivious to the diver. They appear to be in a state of suspended animation, i.e., asleep; you can even pet them, sometimes. Fish have no eyelids, so their eyes are always open even though they don't "see" while asleep.

Other sea creatures sleep during the day and come out only at night (some species of octopus, for example, although they are not fishes). Finally, some fishes, notably some species of shark, appear not to sleep at all.
