Perhaps a wreck or perhaps some reefs. All good diving. Maybe even some large sea turtles or a shark or two.

N. Key Largo

The Elbow, N. Dry Rocks, N. N. Dry Rocks, Grecian Rocks, Carysfort, Shark Reef. Average depth 30', usually no current. Average visibility is 30-50' with many tropicals, moreys, cudas.

JULY 28 AM

Biscayne Nat'l Park & BBQ

BBQ \$10

Sites may include: Rocky Reef, Elkhorn Forest, Ball Buoy, Far Out Reef, Cuda Ledge. Usually no currents, massive corals, small caves. The Keys "Best Kept Secret", only one commercial boat allowed in area. Depth 20-30', vies 30-60'. **BBQ after dive, see article this issue.**

### ADA divers descend on the unspoiled reefs and mountains of Dominica By Connie Crowther

The shafts of light crossed and gleamed, heightening the red, orange, yellow, and purple colors of the deep wall reef. Caught in the divers' shafts of light were lacy basket starfish, twirling crinoids, lively lobsters and anemones in many colors. Myriad other sea creatures heightened the divers' excitement as they plunged 50 feet over the vibrant wall into the dark abyss.

Members of the Active Divers Association were doing a rare night wall dive off the lush, unspoiled central Caribbean island of Dominica when they witnessed this colorful tableau. This memorable dive was just one of a dozen or more our group did during its weeklong sojourn to the island, June 1-8. Some buddy pairs spent most of their waking hours under water, either on the morning two-tank dives or diving in the clear waters just off the Castle Comfort Hotel.

We could not get enough of the gorgeous, pristine reefs and walls, underwater pinnacles, swimthroughs and the veritable checklist of sea life. The island's volcanic origins came to life as we dived a unique site called Champagne, where bubbles rose from the hot vents below the seafloor. The five ADA underwater photographers on the trip had a heyday, taking thousands of shots.

Lon and Maria Von Lintel had the sighting of the week, though, when they spotted a big manta ray skittering over the wall when they were the first to enter the water from the dive boat off the picturesque village of Soufriere.

We also couldn't get enough of the wild mountain rides up 45-degree inclines (Eddie Lim lost all the change out of his pockets as we lurched up one heart-stopping section of the road), the market trips to nearby Roseau, the fresh seafood, vegetables and fruits, and the native breakfasts with fish and johnny cake.

We spent one afternoon whale watching and caught sight of 4-5 big sperm whales that live year-round in the deep waters around Dominica. We hiked to Titou Gorge, one of the Dominican locations where the two latest *Pirates of the Caribbean* films were made, and to Trafalgar Falls. We got wet on both forays, swimming into the gorge to a waterfall and relaxing in the mineral hot springs at the foot of the falls.

Other divers on the trip were Lee Wood, divemaster and trip leader, Sharon Baron, Nansy MacKenzie, Camilo Romano, Carol Kelley, Dafne Martinez, Tom Obermeier, Carol Schurtz, Chuck Porter, Mike Matthews and Connie Crowther.

### ADA PRESENTED EMERGENCY FIRST RESPONSE COURSE MAY 20

Accidents can happen. You never know when or where. You might witness a serious auto collision. You might be on the scene of a beach drowning. You might even need to assist a diver in distress.

Every person who is physically able to help another should be ready to offer some form of first aid. Thanks to ADA member and EFR instructor, Frank Young, 11 more ADA members have the skill and training to help if called upon. You should feel safer than ever on future ADA dives knowing that at least a few of the divers on the boat have probably been recently trained or refreshed as Emergency First Responders.

The course consisted of three hours of hands-on practical training and a written test to determine cognitive learning. The new CPR procedures were demonstrated and practiced repeatedly until techniques were perfected. Thanks to the our friends at the Florida Keys Dive Center we even had access to additional CPR manikins and to Automated External Defibrillator trainers. These amazing machines, found in airports, fire stations, and many other public places, are totally automated and talk you through each step in their set-up and use. Before taking this course, I would have been very reluctant to attempt to use one. Now, I would not hesitate.

I highly recommend everyone, even children, take this course. Frank plans to offer another, even more comprehensive CPR/ First Aid/Oxygen Administration course on September 8th. Watch the newsletter for details.


#### PHOTOS WANTED!!!



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### ADA RULES & REGULATIONS

All Members Must be familiar with the following

## FOR ALL ADVANCED DIVES (DEPTHS OVER 60') ADA DIVERS MUST:

- 1. Be current (dive activity within the previous 3 months).
- 2. Have the approval of an ADA Safety Officer.
- 3. Have a minimum of 25 logged dives.
- Carry an alternate air source (octopus), time keeping device and depth gauge.
- 5. Have previous ADA diving experience.
- 6. All members must dive with at least a 72 cubic foot tank.

### ADA GUIDELINES FOR COMPUTER ASSISTED DIVING

- 1. Members using dive computers may extend their time underwater ten-(10) minutes beyond the time allowed by the tables.
- Computer assisted dives must be well within the NO DECOMPRESSION LIMITS.
- Members should understand and follow the manufacturer's recommendations.
- 4. If a computer diver is buddyed with a diver using the tables, both must follow the tables.
- If a buddy-team is using unlike computers, both must follow the more conservative computer.
- If, in a buddy-team, either computer fails, both divers must terminate the dive.

### CANCELLATION AND REFUND POLICY FOR LOCAL DIVE TRIPS

Because of our contractual agreements with our service agents - dive shops and boat captains, we must notify them - usually seven days in advance - of the final number of spaces we are paying for. Thus, if our members cancel less than seven days in advance, we regret that NO REFUND OR CREDIT can be given, unless trip cancellation insurance has been purchased at the time of the dive trip payment (see next news article!)

#### ADA TRIP CANCELLATION INSURANCE

The Board of Directors has approved a unique concept in local diving: NO FAULT INSURANCE!!

For an additional \$5.00, per person, per local dive trip, members can eliminate the worry of losing their dive fees because of an unforeseen change of plans.

If, for any reason you are unable to attend a local dive for which you are scheduled and have paid the insurance, ADA will credit your dive fee to another date. The \$5.00 insurance is non-transferable and non-refundable!

When you make a reservation, ask for dive trip cancellation insurance. The Board has elected to continue the insurance offer for this year.

NOTE: It may be discontinued at any time without prior written notice.

### IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM THE SAFETY OFFICERS' COMMITTEE

All members are reminded to read the "Rules & Guidelines for Diving Activities" you received with your membership package. Number 16 states, "All divers must be present for the pre-dive briefing". If the diver is not present for the entire briefing, diving privileges may be revoked for that dive. Please plan to arrive on time - or better yet - a bit early. We thank you and appreciate your cooperation.

#### IMPORTANT WEATHER INFORMATION

Before departing for the dive site, confirm weather condition with Lon or the designated Safety Officer. It is the responsibility of the member to call; we cannot call you due to the large number of divers involved. For morning dives, call between 6 and 10 p.m. the night before the dive. For afternoon dives, call between 9 and 10 a.m. the morning of the dive.

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#### HOW TO MAKE DIVE RESERVATIONS

- 1. Check this newsletter or the annual calendar for upcoming dives.
- 2. Call Lon (305) 251-4975 to make a reservation. Please do not leave a message on the answering machine, The trip may be full.
- 3. We will hold your reservation for four (4) days from the date you call. If we do not receive payment within four days, your space may me given to other members. If you wish to confirm receipt, call Lon.
- 4. Ask for details about the trip when you call. Otherwise, details will be given when you call for a weather report. See important weather information in this and every issue)
- 5. Make your check payable to ACTIVE DIVERS ASSOCIATION. Not to any individual, and mail to : Lon Von Lintel , 13374 SW 46 Terrace Miami, Fl. 33175
- 7. Itemize dates of dives in the left hand corner of your check.
- 8. REMEMBER! That family members must have completed individual documentation to register as ADA members.

When making dive reservations or during the all important WEATHER CHECK.

Inquire about the ADA CHECK-IN TIME. Please arrive on time, or better yet, a bit earlier and chat with new friends and old buddies.
