OCT 7, SUN AFTERNOON ⇒ W. PALM (ADVANCED)

\$35.00

Drift diving at it's best. Usual to see turtles, sharks, eels, jewfish and other big animals. Depths 80-100', visibility usually 60-80'. Sometimes cold thermalclines, bring your wetsuit. **See advanced criterion this issue.**

\$29.00

Sites include: Molasses, Spanish Anchor, Hole-in-wall, French, Pickles. Average depth 35-40', average visibility 50-70', expect currents and high voltage action. High profile corals.

OCT 20, SAT MORNING ⇒ BISCAYNE NATL PARK

\$ 5.00 (Tanks Incl.) (BBQ \$7)

Sites may include: Rocky Reef, Elkhorn Forest, Ball Buoy, Far Out Reef, Cuda Ledge. Usually no currents, massive corals, small caves. The Keys "Best Kept Secret", only one commercial boat allowed in area. Depth 20-30', vis 30-60'. **BBQ after dive, see article this issue.**

OCT 28, SUN AFTERNOON BOYNTON BEACH (ADVANCED)

\$35.00

Drift dive with currents, reef or wreck, big animals. Average depth 80', visibility 40-60'. **See advanced criterion this issue.**

\$35.00

Our favorite Coast Guard Cutter, upright in over 100 feet of blue water. It DOES count even when you don't touch bottom! OUR LIMIT 100 feet! See advanced criterion this issue.

NOV 11, SUN MORNING ⇒ BISCAYNE NATL. PARK (ADVANCED)

\$ 5.00 (Tanks Incl.) (BBQ \$7)

Sites - The Wall, Anniversary, Rocky Reef, Elkhorn Forest, Cuda Ledge, Ball Buoy, Doc DeMilly. Expect currents, usually we drift dive the deep reefs. Depths 70-110', average visibility 40-80'. Only one commercial dive boat allowed in area. **See advanced criterion this issue. BBQ after dive, see article this issue.**

NOV 18, SUN AFTERNOON ⇒ POMPANO (ADVANCED)

\$35.00

Drift dive with the currents, perhaps a deep reef or a wreck. Average depth 80', visibility 40-60', good chance of huge turtles. **See advanced criterion this issue.**

ADA DIVES WITH NATIONAL GEOGRAPHIC

The ADA dive Sept. 9 was a good dive as usual. But this day had some surprises. The local controversy on shark feeding and shark attacks has attracted the attention of the international media, including the world-renowned National Geographic Magazine and a newspaper from Great Britain. Both sent film crews and/or reporters to Key Largo this day to see first hand what the fuss is all about. By coincidence, Captain Slate of Atlantis Dive Center scheduled us and the journalists to share a boat for his famous "Creature Feature" where he feeds cudas, eels, and sharks. Before, during and after the dive, the reporters filmed Captain Slate and ADA members, conducted one-on-one interviews and took pictures. The dive came off without incident as usual. Slate stated "You are among 70,000 others who have enjoyed this experience and no one has been bitten." One reporter from Great Britain, a novice diver on his first dive, was really pumped- he was allowed to hold a 6 foot nurse shark in his arms! National Geographic plans to air their report in September and the British paper will publish their report on the web. ADA will send e-mail to our members when details become available.

The tanks were marked with a Retester ID Number that belongs to another company. These tanks may pose a safety risk to the public. Anyone who has a tank that has been serviced by Underwater Adventures and that is marked with RIN numbers B095 or B059 should consider the tank unsafe." OFF SEASON DIVING

As most of the members know, our season as a club ends this year on November 18th.

Many have asked why we don't continue with scheduled club dives into the winter months. The reason is the uncertainty of weather, resulting in many weather-related trip cancellations. This makes it very difficult to administer.

However, during the off-season, Lon and I do dive almost every weekend, weather permitting. Frequently, others have asked us to let them know when we do go, so they can join us.

This off-season, if you wish to be made aware of such dives, let me know. I will keep a list of those wishing to be notified, and will call each week we're going out, early in the week, and give you the opportunity to go with us.

These dives however, are **NOT** Club Sponsored, so each person will call the appropriate shop that week to make his or her own reservation. There will be no ADA Safety Officer on duty and ADA assumes no liability or responsibility.

ADA RULES & REGULATIONS All Members Must be familiar with the following

FOR ALL ADVANCED DIVES (DEPTHS OVER 60') ADA DIVERS MUST:

- **1.** Be current (dive activity within the previous 3 months).
- 2. Have the approval of an ADA Safety Officer.
- 3. Have a minimum of 25 logged dives.
- Carry an alternate air source (octopus), time keeping device and depth gauge.
- **5.** Have previous ADA diving experience.
- 6. All members must dive with at least a 72 cubic foot tank.

ADA GUIDELINES FOR COMPUTER ASSISTED DIVING

- Members using dive computers may extend their time underwater ten-(10) minutes beyond the time allowed by the tables.
- Computer assisted dives must be well within the NO DECOMPRESSION LIMITS.
- Members should understand and follow the manufacturer's recommendations.
- **4.** If a computer diver is buddied with a diver using the tables, both must follow the tables.
- **5.** If a buddy-team is using unlike computers, both must follow the more conservative computer.
- **6.** If, in a buddy-team, either computer fails, both divers must terminate the dive.

IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM THE SAFETY OFFICERS' COMMITTEE

All members are reminded to read the "Rules & Guidelines for Diving Activities" you received with your membership package. Number 16 states, "All divers must be present for the pre-dive briefing". If the diver is not present for the entire briefing, diving privileges may be revoked for that dive. Please plan to arrive on time - or better yet - a bit early. We thank you and appreciate your cooperation.

CANCELLATION AND REFUND POLICY FOR LOCAL DIVE TRIPS

Because of our contractual agreements with our service agents - dive shops and boat captains, we must notify them usually seven days in advance - of the final number of spaces we are paying for. Thus, if our members cancel less than seven days in advance, we regret that NO REFUND OR CREDIT can be given, unless trip cancellation insurance has been purchased at the time of the dive trip payment (see next news article!)

ADA TRIP CANCELLATION INSURANCE

The Board of Directors has approved a unique concept in local diving: NO FAULT INSURANCE!!

For an additional \$5.00, per person, per local dive trip, members can eliminate the worry of losing their dive fees because of an unforeseen change of plans.

If, for any reason you are unable to attend a local dive for which you are scheduled and have paid the insurance, ADA will credit your \$29.00 dive fee to another date. The \$5.00 insurance is non-transferable and non-refundable!

When you make a reservation, ask for dive trip cancellation insurance.

The Board has elected to continue the insurance offer for 2001.

NOTE: It may be discontinued at any time without prior written notice.

Please call Lon with your questions and comments.

IMPORTANT WEATHER INFORMATION

Before departing for the dive site, confirm weather condition with Lon or the designated Safety Officer. It is the responsibility of the member to call; we cannot call you due to the large number of divers involved. For morning dives, call between 6 and 10 p.m. the night before the dive. For afternoon dives, call between 9 and 10 a.m. the morning of the dive.

ADVICE TO OLDER DIVERS

Through Project Dive Exploration DAN is trying to answer questions about aging and diving. Using Doppler to detect venous gas emboli over the heart of divers, they found that 30% more bubbles was found in divers at age 57 than those at age 33, and 20 % more in males than females. They concluded that "If we are cardiovascularly fit, exercise regularly, not more than 20% overweight, and have no serious potentially incapacitating disease, we shouldn't stop diving. BUT as we age beyond 60 we might consider limiting our diving to shallower depths...." For complete info on this subject see "Alert Diver" July 2001



- 3) We will hold your reservation for four (4) days from the date you call. If we do not receive payment within four days, your space may be given to other members. If you wish to confirm receipt, call Lon.
- 4) Ask for details about the trip when you call. Otherwise, details will be given when you call for a weather check. (See "Important Weather Information" this and every issue)
- Make your check payable to ACTIVE DIVERS ASSOCIATION, not to any individual, and mail to: Lon Von Lintel, 15305 SW 104 Ave., Miami, FL 33157
- Itemize dates of dives on bottom-left corner of check.

7) Do not pay for persons other than spouses or other family members. Include their names on check.

REMEMBER: That family members must have completed individual documentation to register as ADA members.
