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Interesting in Diving the Dry Tortugas in October 21—24?

I'm thinking of signing up for a liveaboard (non-ADA) dive trip to the Dry Tortugas in October and am wondering if other ADA members might be interested in going too.

The Dry Tortugas are about 70 miles from Key West, and some wonderful natural resources are found here, including sea turtles, more pristine coral reefs than are normally seen near the mainland/Florida Keys, and hundreded of species of fish. The area also has important nesting colonies of birds, and features Fort Jefferson (part of Dry Tortugas National Park). This area is closer to Cuba than to Key West!

#### Diving Medicine Articles Marine Life Trauma

#### Lionfish, Scorpionfish & Stonefish Envenomations:

Soaking the wound in non-scalding hot water to tolerance (110 to 113 F / 43.3 to 45 C)

- may provide dramatic relief of pain from a lionfish sting,
- is less likely to be effective for a scorpionfish sting, and
- may have little or no effect on the pain from a stonefish sting, but it should be done nonetheless, because the heat may inactivate some of the harmful components of the venom.

If the injured person appears intoxicated or is weak, vomiting, short of breath or unconscious, seek immediate advanced medical care

Wound care is standard, so, for the blistering wound, appropriate therapy would be a topical antiseptic (such as silver sulfadiazene [Silvadene] cream or bacitracin ointment) and daily dressing changes. A scorpionfish sting frequently requires weeks to months to heal, and therefore requires the attention of a physician. There is an antivenin available to physicians to help manage the sting of the dreaded stonefish.

#### Ciguatera Poisoning

Ciguatera fish poisoning involves a large number of tropical and semitropical bottom-feeding fish that dine on plants or smaller fish, which have accumulated toxins from microscopic dinoflagellates, such as Gambierdiscus toxicus. Therefore, the larger the fish, the greater the toxicity. The ciguatoxin-carrying fish most commonly ingested include the jack, barracuda, grouper and snapper.

Symptoms, which usually begin 15 to 30 minutes after eating the contaminated fish, include abdominal pain, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, tongue and throat numbness, tooth pain, difficulty in walking, blurred vision, skin rash, itching, tearing of the eyes, weakness, twitching muscles, incoordination, difficulty sleeping and occasional difficulty in breathing. A classic sign of ciguatera intoxication is the reversal of hot and cold sensation (hot liquids seem cold, and vice versa), which may reflect general hypersensitivity to temperature.

Persons can become severely ill shortly after they are poisoned, with heart problems, low blood pressure, deficiencies of the central and peripheral nervous systems, and generalized collapse. Unfortunately, many of the debilitating, but not life-threatening, symptoms may persist in varying severity for weeks to months.

#### The Treatment

Treatment is for the most part based upon symptoms without any specific antidote, although certain drugs are beginning to prove useful for aspects of the syndrome, such as intravenous mannitol for abnormal nervous system behavior and abnormal heart rhythms. A physician must undertake these therapies.

Prochlorperazine may be useful for vomiting; hydroxyzine or cool showers may be useful for itching. There are chemical tests to determine the presence of ciguatoxins in fish and in the bloodstream of humans, but not yet a specific antidote. If a person displays symptoms of ciguatera fish poisoning, he/she should be see a physician promptly.

During recovery from ciguatera poisoning, the injured person should exclude the following from the diet: fish, fish sauces, shellfish, shellfish sauces, alcoholic beverages, nuts and nut oils.

#### ADA RULES & REGULATIONS All Members Must be familiar with the following

## FOR ALL ADVANCED DIVES (DEPTHS OVER 60') ADA DIVERS MUST:

- 1. Be current (dive activity within the previous 3 months).
- 2. Have the approval of an ADA Safety Officer.
- 3. Have a minimum of 25 logged dives.
- 4. Carry an alternate air source (octopus), time keeping device and depth gauge.
- 5. Have previous ADA diving experience.
- 6. All members must dive with at least a 72 cubic foot tank.

## ADA GUIDELINES FOR COMPUTER ASSISTED DIVING

- 1. Members using dive computers may extend their time underwater ten-(10) minutes beyond the time allowed by the tables.
- 2. Computer assisted dives must be well within the NO DECOMPRESSION LIMITS.
- Members should understand and follow the manufacturer's recommendations.
- 4. If a computer diver is buddyed with a diver using the tables, both must follow the tables.
- If a buddy-team is using unlike computers, both must follow the more conservative computer.
- 6. If, in a buddy-team, either computer fails, both divers must terminate the dive.

#### **IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM**

#### THE SAFETY OFFICERS' COMMITTEE

All members are reminded to read the "Rules & Guidelines for Diving Activities" you received with your membership package. Number 16 states, "All divers must be present for the pre-dive briefing". If the diver is not present for the entire briefing, diving privileges may be revoked for that dive. Please plan to arrive on time - or better yet - a bit early. We thank you and appreciate your cooperation.

#### CANCELLATION AND REFUND POLICY

#### FOR LOCAL DIVE TRIPS

Because of our contractual agreements with our service agents dive shops and boat captains, we must notify them - usually seven days in advance - of the final number of spaces we are paying for. Thus, if our members cancel less than seven days in advance, we regret that *NO REFUND OR CREDIT* can be given, unless trip cancellation insurance has been purchased at the time of the dive trip payment (see next news article!)

### ADA TRIP CANCELLATION INSURANCE

The Board of Directors has approved a unique concept in local diving: NO FAULT INSURANCE!!

For an additional \$5.00, per person, per local dive trip, members can eliminate the worry of losing their dive fees because of an unforeseen change of plans.

If, for any reason you are unable to attend a local dive for which you are scheduled and have paid the insurance, ADA will credit your dive fee to another date. *The \$5.00 insurance is non-transferable and non-refundable!* 

When you make a reservation, ask for dive trip cancellation insurance. The Board has elected to continue the insurance offer for this year.

NOTE: It may be discontinued at any time without prior written notice.

#### IMPORTANT WEATHER INFORMATION

Before departing for the dive site, confirm weather condition with Lon or the designated Safety Officer. It is the responsibility of the member to call; we cannot call you due to the large number of divers involved. For morning dives, call between 6 and 10 p.m. the night before the dive. For afternoon dives, call between 9 and 10 a.m. the morning of the dive.

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#### HOW TO MAKE DIVE RESERVATIONS

- 1. Check this newsletter or the annual calendar for upcoming dives.
- 2. Call Lon (305) 251-4975 to make a reservation. Please do not leave a message on the answering machine, The trip may be full.
- 3. We will hold your reservation for four (4) days from the date you call. If we do not receive payment within four days, your space may me given to other members. If you wish to confirm receipt, call Lon.
- 4. Ask for details about the trip when you call. Otherwise, details will be given when you call for a weather report. See important weather information in this and every issue)
- 5. Make your check payable to ACTIVE DIVERS ASSOCIATION. Not to any individual, and mail to : Jerry Kosakowski ,8221 NW 8 Place Plantation, FI 33324
- 7. Itemize dates of dives in the left hand corner of your check.
- 8. REMEMBER! That family members must have completed individual documentation to register as ADA members.
